Chapter 1

Chapter 2

Overview of the Library

Prologue

2.1 Establishment of icddr, b

icddr, b was established in Dhaka in the 1960s as the Southeast Asian Treaty Organization (SEATO) Cholera Research Institute. In the 1960s CRL he also established a major health and demographic watchdog in Matlab. It is now the longest running institution of its kind in the Global South and has inspired many similar institutions around the world. In 1962, CRL established the Dhaka Hospital, still run by him icddr, b, to meet the urgent need for treatment of patients with severe diarrheal diseases, especially young children. Dhaka Hospital has developed into a nationally significant treatment center and provides infrastructure for extensive clinical research programs. 1978 CRL received a new impetus and a new name which is International Centre for Diarrheal Diseases Research, Bangladesh. In recent years we were simply known as icddr, b.






Figure 1: icddr, b Main Building icddr, b Library

2.2 Background of icddr, b

icddr,b has its roots in the SEATO Cholera Institute, founded in 1960. When Bangladesh became independent in 1971, its activities were curtailed due to lack of funds. A bilateral agreement was then signed by Bangladesh and his USAID for the direct flow of funds to the organization. By 1978, there were many research achievements, including ORS, the patho-physiology of bacillary dysentery, rotavirus, and uplifting family planning programs. The organization was established in its present form by an ordinance promulgated by President Ziaur Rahman and ratified by Congress for the Treatment of Diarrhea and Cholera in 1979. Oral rehydration therapy is believed to have saved over 50 million people worldwide.

Since 1978, the center has trained over 27,000 medical professionals from over 78 countries. This course provides practical training in hospital management of diarrheal diseases, epidemiology, biostatistics, family planning, demographic monitoring, and child survival strategies. As child deaths from disease have declined, deaths from injuries such as B. Drowning pose a proportionately greater threat to child survival.

2.3 icddr, b Library

icddr, b Cholera Research Library was founded in 1962. icddr, b Library and Information Services Division is the preeminent medical and public health library in the region. Its mission is to make the knowledge and results of global health research available to scientists in icddr, b and the international research community. The Department of Library and Information Services maintains state-of-the-art libraries and information centers with the latest tools and information technology for collecting, processing, and storing information. It currently holds a collection of over 49,307 bound journals, magazines and books.




Figure 2: icddr, b Library and Information Service Section

2.4 Aims, Objectives, and Mission of icddr, b Library







Figure 4: icddr, b Library floor and map




Figure 8: research4life user interface





Figure 9: research4life Summon Search




Figure 10: Print and online collections of icddr, b Library

- Unpublished or easily lost ("gray") literature (papers, technical reports, etc.).




Figure 11: Institutional Knowledge Repository (IKR) of icddr,b

Chapter 3

Activities and experience in the library (section wise)

3.1 Overview

A library is an organized collection of sources of information and similar resources, make accessible to defined community for reference and borrowing. The library division of the icddr, b library started its journey in 1962. The library and information service section are situated on the 4th floor of the main building. The library has full of resources which is arrange in an organized way. They are using (IKR) Institutional Knowledge Repository. This is basically Search engine for digital resources. Anyone can browse by community, collection, author or publication date, or use the *search* function to find a specific article. If anyone can want to access details information, then they have to login here. If anyone want to access virtually then he/she has to come circulation desk for check-in and checkout resources. This library is managed by 5 library persons.

3.2 Library Sections

The icddr, b library has a large number of resources. They have conducted many other activities such as meeting and training programs, conferences and seminars and many more. All this work is done by individual sections. Each section has one person in charge who keeps track of all activities in the library. At icddr, b library experts always provide researchers, doctors and scientists with their best service. Since this is a medical library, most of the resources here are medical-related resources. However, they also provide other resources based on the icddr, b user request. They are using Shetu interface. Library professional and some other departments has given ID & Password. But it not uses for everyone. If anyone want to get access for library resources, he/she must have that ID & Password.

A section of the acquisition is done by the Administrative librarian. The component that exists within the library. Various administrative tasks are performed here. This area covers the administrative needs of the entire library. Every library worker needs, keeping personal documents and files for all officers, planning annual reports, the traditions of all committees such as library committee meetings and the preparation of minutes thereof, employee Curriculum actions on staff, attempts to transmit proposals to authorities to the public, reviews of all staff, etc. In this administrative section deals with many other works such as —



4.1 How to select library resources for acquisition?

The procurement department is responsible for the selection and purchase of reading materials. An integral part of the library's collection. Books will be added to this section. We maintain a comprehensive and up-to-date inventory of such books and other reading materials. They usually choose books based on their research topic. In icddr, the b-library typically selects and purchases medical resources. Because the icddr, b library is a medical library and many researchers and scientists work here. Select library resources based on user requirements, then justify these requirements.

They have 5 scientific divisions



These five divisions mainly deal with children's nutrition, HIV, maternal and child health and many more. In all departments they also work on some special activities. Special Activities means Focused Research Areas. These resources are essential for icddr, b scholars and researchers. so that they can be used those resources for research and scientific work. Buy resources that will help them. The icddr, b library is always ready to help you purchase the resources that they need. This is basically the book selection process of icddr, b library.

4.2Library Budget

icddr, b always creates an annual budget in September of every year. A budget is very important for any organization. At first icddr, b library staffs plan how many resources to purchase and how much they need. All work is done by Suchona (ERP). The ERP also indicates deadlines. In icddr, b library budget is managed by this control area. Each budget section is assigned a specific amount. If a branch needs supplies, the branch staff will notify the General Budget Division through the icddr, b library administrator.

There are two types of annual budgets. One is restricted and the other is not restricted. Whose are work in project activity, they have limited budget and they have to complete their work in that specific amount. The research budget is usually provided by donors. But in icddr, b librarians, if they need more budget then they can get because icddr, b library is a fixed term and they belong to the Support Services Division. They have a salary budget and have a budget code and a budget number.

4.3 Communications with vendors or publishers

Procurement is basically work with vendors. In icddr, b, they already have some listed vendors. When choosing a resource, contact the publisher or vendor. If it's a local vendor, they just want a quotation, but if it's an international vendor, they will ask for a quotation and send it. The provider will then receive the offer by email. This is how they communicate with vendors and publishers. Once all information such as book price, book name, etc. has been provided, procurement is ready for order. In icddr, b usually shop locally for Karim International.

4.4Budget clearance and final approval

All this budget related work was done by investigator (PI).PI usually decides everything. How much does it cost on their budget? Then click on the cheat list. Then it goes for final approval. If there is a plan, then they need permission to do this work. In this way they run their library according to their budget.

4.5Library automation

This is primarily the creation, setup, control and delivery of modern library data systems, all of which need to be automated. In today's information age, automation is having a major impact on many areas of libraries and information centers. Library automation refers to the use of automated electronic hardware (computers) to perform routine library tasks such as retrieving, moving, classifying, citing, and managing journals. Checking (H- index= Research index) etc.

Chapter 5Section of Processing

Section of Processing

One of the most important sections of a library is the processing section which is maintained by the technical section of the library. Without processing no book can be made accessible for users. For users, they always ready to serve their best resources. And for serve, they have to maintain some rules. So that users always satisfied for their service and save users time also. They use outlook. This is like G-mail. Every information they deliver with using their root mail.

3.1Bibliographic Standards Used by the Processing Section

The processing section of the icddr, b library maintains bibliographic standards which is National Library of Medicine (NLM).

3.2 Shelving

When comes any books or journals, at first it go for processing. After processing, library assistant in the library section keep their books to allocate shelves.

3.3 Shelves Arrangement (Regularly)

They have huge amount of collections. The library shelves are arrange very systematically. Icddr, b library is a medical library and they maintain bibliographic standards which is National Library of Medicine (NLM). In processing part, they are doing two things. These Ares-

• **Check arrangement** – They frequently check that all the book arrangements. They have bound journal and book shelves. They have also new arrival shelves, icddr, b annual report shelves and many more.

3.4 Section of Periodicals

The icddr, b library maintains a sizeable set of listed journals that are currently available on bound volumes and open for users. The Periodicals section is mainly on his 1st shelf in the library. A place where newly curate publications can be exhibited and studied. Bound journal volumes are stored on shelves, icddr, b users can make copies at icddr, b lending facilities. Users can read the journals they want online, but they are not allowed to print them for personal use. Copying of magazine articles is possible. They have some space problem that is why they sent huge amount of bound journals to (NHLDC) which is National Health Library and Document Center. The journals of the icddr, b library subscribe to online publications through the Libraries Consortium of Bangladesh (LiCOB) and the UGC Digital Library (UDL). The Resources are-Springer Nature, EMBSCO, Cambridge University Press, Wiley Online Library, and JSTOR.

Circulation is another important part of any library. In icddr, b library all the circulation work done by the library assistant. She has to follow all the library work which is done by the users and other staff also.




Figure 15: icddr, b Library Circulation Section




Figure 21: Regular usages materials.
